1.3. TARIFF REVISION SYMBOLS

A switching system that provides a traffic concentration and distribution function for originating or terminating traffic between end offices and a Customer's premises.



The term "End User" means any wholesale or retail customer of an interstate or
foreign telecommunications service that is not a carrier. The term "End User"
may also refer to origination or termination locations accessed via contractual or other arrangements with an affiliated or unaffiliated provider of interconnected or non-interconnected VoIP service.

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1.4. **DEFINITIONS (CONT'D)**

(D) <u>Interconnected VoIP Service</u> (N) An interconnected VoIP service is a service that (i) enables real-time, two-way voice communications: (ii) requires a broadband connection from the user's location; (iii) requires internet protocol-compatible customer premises equipment (CPE); and (iv) permits users generally to receive calls that originate on the public switched telephone network and to terminate calls to the public switched telephone network. (N)

Local Access and Transport Area (LATA)

A geographic area established for the provision and administration of communications service. It encompasses one or more designated exchanges, which are grouped to serve common social, economic and other purposes.

Local Calling Area

A geographical area, as defined in the Company's Local Exchange Tariff in which **(T)** an End User may complete a call without incurring toll usage charges.

Non-interconnected VoIP Service

The term "non-interconnected VoIP service" means a service that (i) enables realtime voice communications that originate from or terminate to the user's location using Internet protocol or any successor protocol; and (ii) requires Internet protocol compatible customer premises equipment; and (iii) does not include any service that is an interconnected VoIP service.

Point of Termination

The point of termination within a customer-designated premises at which the Company's responsibility for the provision of access service ends. The point of termination is the point of interconnection between Company communications facilities and customer-provided facilities as defined in Part 68 of the FCC's Rules and Regulations.

Tandem Transport

Trunk Gateway (N)

The point of interface between the PSTN trunk facility and the Company defined by Common Language Location Identifier (CLLI) codes assigned to the Company, as reflected in the Local Exchange Routing Guide (LERG). Services provided at a Trunk Gateway location are the functional equivalent of services provided at an End Office location.
